Treasurer's Report

The 2018-19 Season has been a challenging year for the Club, with Treasurer Caterina Timpano-Hair stepping down in August 2018. I take this opportunity on behalf of the Management Committee to thank Caterina for undertaking this role. I came into the position in January 2019.

This season has seen significant effort put into the engagement of a new Club Administrator, Sharon Phillips, reviewing the current accounting structure, a new sub-lease with the Tugun Surf Life Saving Supporters Club, and progressing funding via a loan through the Tugun Investment Trust for the installation of a lift within the Surf Club.

The Club has received grants this season from the SLSA Beach Safety Equipment Fund, Qld Fire and Emergency Services, Cancer Council Queensland and Gold Coast City Council (via Point Danger Branch). The nippers successfully obtained significant sponsorship support from a number of companies, including Blooms Chemist: The Pines, G and L Formwork and Semi-Trailer Rentals Qld Pty Ltd. Additionally, the Club participated in the Qld Government "Get Started" program, which provides vouchers to families to cover registration fees to promote the engagement of children in sport. With assistance from the SLSA Foundation, we have also submitted a grant application to the Qld Government Gambling Community Benefit Fund for a new vehicle. Successful grants will be announced in October 2019.

This season the Club has experienced a deficit of \$31,246.67, compared to last season's deficit of \$105,777.00, indicating the Club is slowly moving in the right direction.

As we move into the new season, the focus for the Club will shift to sourcing funding for building improvements such as a new roof and increasing sponsorship opportunities.





NOTE 1: SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Corporate Information

The financial statements are special purpose financial statements prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act and the Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Act, The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

Basis of Preparation

The financial statements are for the Tugun Surf Life Saving Club Inc as an individual entity, incorporated and domiciled in Australia, The Tugun Surf Life Saving Club Inc is an association incorporated in Queensland under the Associations Incorporation Act and is registered as a charity under the Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Act.

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historic costs and do not take into account changing money values or, except where stated specifically, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following Australian accounting standards have been applied in the preparation of these financial statements:

AASB 101 - Presentation of Financial Statements

AASB 107 - Statement of Cash Flows

AASB 108 - Accounting Policies, Changes in Accounting Estimates and Errors

AASB 1048 - Interpretation of Standards

AASB 1054 - Australian Additional Disclosures

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless stated otherwise, have been adopted in the preparation of these financial statements.

Accounting Policies

a. Income Tax

No provision for income tax has been raised as the association is exempt from income tax under Section 50-10 of the Income Tax Assessment Act. Tugun Surf Life Saving Club Inc is a Public Benevolent Institution (PBI) and has been endorsed by the Australian Taxation Office to receive tax concessions. Further, Tugun Surf Life Saving Club Inc is endorsed as a Deductible Gift Recipient (DGR).

b. Comparative Figures

When required by Accounting Standards, comparative figures have been adjusted to conform with changes in presentation for the current financial year. When required, comparative information is reclassified where appropriate to enhance comparability.

c. Economic Dependence

Tugun Surf Life Saving Club Inc is dependent on the Tugun Surf Life Saving Supporters Association Inc for funds used to meet it's financial commitments. At the date of this report the committee members have no reason to believe the Tugun Surf Life Saving Supporters Association Inc will not continue to support Tugun Surf Life Saving Club Inc.

d. Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO).

Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of the amount of GST receivable or payable. The net amount of GST receivable from, or payable to, the ATO is included with other receivables or payables in the Statement of Financial Position.

Cash flows are presented on a gross basis. The GST components of cash flows arising from investing or financing activities which are recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO are presented as operating cash flows included in receipts from customers or payments to suppliers.

NOTE 1: SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

e. Critical Accounting Estimates and Judgments

The committee of management evaluate estimates and judgments in the financial report based on historical knowledge and best available information. Estimates assume a reasonable expectation of future events and are based on current trends and economic data, obtained both externally and within the Association.

Key estimates

The estimate of the useful life of plant & equipment is reviewed at least annually to confirm that the remaining life of material assets is reflected on the asset register. There were no other critical accounting estimates to be considered during the year or during preparation of this financial report.

Key ludaments

The methods of depreciation are used to provide a consistent usage of the useful life of plant & equipment. The methods also allow, where required, for the plant & equipment to be fully written down at a specific point in time such as the end of the lease term. There were no other critical accounting judgments made by the committee of management.

f. Contributions

If and when Tugun Surf Life Saving Club Inc receives non-reciprocal contributions from the government or other parties for nothing or a nominal value the contributions would be recognised at the fair value on the date of acquisition upon which time an asset is taken up in the Statement of Financial Position and revenue in the Statement of Profit or Loss and Other Comprehensive Income.

a. Revenue

Revenue from the sale of goods is recognised upon the delivery of goods to customers.

Grant revenue is recognised in the Statement of Profit or Loss and Other Comprehensive Income when the association obtains control of the grant and it is probable that the economic benefits gained from the grant will flow to the association and the amount of the grant can be measured reliably.

Donations and bequests are recognised as revenue when received.

Interest revenue is recognised on a proportional basis taking into account the interest rates applicable to the financial assets.

Revenue from the rendering of a service is recognised upon the delivery of the service to the customers.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

h. Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at-call with banks, other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of twelve months or less, and bank overdrafts.

i. Trade and Other Receivables

Trade and other receivables include amounts due from members as well as amounts receivable from other entities. Receivables expected to be collected within twelve months of the end of the reporting period are classified as current assets. All other receivables are classified as non-current assets.

j. Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value,

k. Property, Plant and Equipment

Each class of property, buildings, plant and equipment is carried at cost or fair value less, where applicable, accumulated depreciation and impairment losses.

Leasehold improvements, plant and equipment

Leasehold improvements, plant and equipment are measured on the cost basis and are therefore carried at cost less accumulated depreciation and any accumulated impairment losses. In the event the carrying amount of leasehold improvements, plant and equipment is greater than its estimated recoverable amount, the carrying amount is written down immediately to its estimated recoverable amount and impairment losses are recognised either in profit or loss or as a revaluation decrease if the impairment losses relate to a revalued asset. A formal assessment of recoverable amount is made when impairment indicators are present (refer to Note 1m for details of impairment).

Leasehold improvements, plant and equipment that have been contributed at no cost, or for nominal cost, are valued and recognised at the fair value of the asset at the date it is acquired.

Depreciation

The depreciable amount of leasehold improvements, plant and equipment is depreciated on a straight line basis over the asset's useful life to the association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use. The rates used for each class of depreciable assets are:

The assets' residual values and useful lives are reviewed, and adjusted if appropriate, at the end of each reporting period.

Gains and losses on disposals are determined by comparing proceeds with the carrying amount. These gains or losses are included in the Statement of Profit or Loss and Other Comprehensive Income. When revalued assets are sold, amounts included in the revaluation reserve relating to that asset are transferred to retained surplus.

I. Trade and Other Payables

Trade and other payables represent the liabilities for goods and services received by the association during the reporting period that remain unpaid at the end of the reporting period. The balance is recognised as a current liability with the amounts normally paid within thirty days of recognition of the liability.

m. Impairment of Assets

At the end of each reporting period, the committee members assess whether there is any indication that an asset may be impaired. If such an indication exists, an impairment test is carried out on the asset by comparing the recoverable amount of the asset, being the higher of the asset's fair value less costs to sell and value in use, to the asset's carrying amount. Any excess of the asset's carrying amount over its recoverable amount is recognised immediately in profit or loss, unless the asset is carried at a revalued amount in accordance with another Standard (e.g. in accordance with the revaluation model in AASB 116). Any impairment loss of a revalued asset is treated as a revaluation decrease in accordance with that other Standard.

Where it is not possible to estimate the recoverable amount of an individual asset, the committee members estimate the recoverable amount of the cash-generating unit to which the asset belongs.

n. Leases

Lease payments for operating leases, where substantially all the risks and benefits remain with the lessor, are recognised as expenses on a straight-line basis over the lease term.
