- Stan Damro and his team for undertaking maintenance around the Club and saving us considerable resources;
- Sean Frampton has been very busy scanning our photos to a digital format, enabling us to preserve our club history;
- Paul Bell has coordinated the Club Raffle and raised significant funds for the Club; and
- Mick Taylor for repairs to the ATV.

Congratulations must go to Murray Seaton and his team in the Nippers, who are going ahead in leaps and bounds, both in numbers. I believe the largest increase in the Branch, and competition achievements, albeit over a shortened season. Murray was also nominated by Branch and received the MacPherson Community Award this season for his contributions to the development of our nippers.

We have worked closely with our Supporters Club this season to finalise the sub-lease and at the time of writing we are pleased to confirm the Gold Coast City Council have approved. Additionally, the development application to undertake repairs to the Club roof has also been approved by the Council Community services, with the Building Application now to be processed. We are also working closely with the Council to finalise the development application for the installation of the lifts and upgrades for the Building disability access.

Thank you to Jason Smith, who coordinated the redevelopment of our Club Website in partnership with "Boost Social". This has significantly improved our face to the community.

On behalf of the Club our sincere thanks to Point Danger Branch for all their patience and support of the Club. We also take this opportunity to congratulate Kerrie Barnes, the Branch Manager on her new appointment to SLSQ and we wish her every success for the future.

TREASURERS REPORT

The Tugun Surf Life Saving Club Inc. has performed solidly over the 2019/20 season and delivered an operating surplus of \$44,556. This represents a turnaround of \$76K when compared to the prior year deficit of (\$31,247). This favourable result may be contributed to the following key revenue areas:

- Rent revenue from the Tugun SLS Supporters Assoc Inc. of \$111,000;
- Government grants received of \$58,339;
- Membership fees of \$53,260;
- Sponsorships & Donations received of \$46,864;
- Surf Club raffle revenue of \$29,475;
- Merchandise sales of \$27,428; and
- Nipper BBQ sales of \$24,745.

Operating expenses continue to be tightly monitored. The Club balance sheet remains stable with a Net Asset position of \$2.014 million and sound cash reserves.

A major achievement for the season has been the completion of the Sublease between the Surf Club and the Supporters Club. The Committees of both clubs dedicated many hours of work toward completing the agreement and it was extremely satisfying to see this finalised. Special thanks must go to our Club Administrator, Sharon and secretary of the Supporters Club, Terani, for their tireless efforts to ensure this task was completed to such a high standard.

The finalisation of the sublease shall facilitate the commencement of project works that have been placed on hold for many months pending approval from GCCC. Priority projects are the installation of the elevators and repairs to the existing roof. Some minor works have been completed this year within the boatshed. Namely, the replacement of the beachfront roller doors and repairs to the boatshed floor.

The Tugun SLSC is well placed to continue to prosper as it approaches its 100th year. The success of the Surf Life Saving Club is intrinsically linked to the prosperity of the Tugun Supporters Club. It is imperative that the two clubs work in a co-operative manner to support one another through the economic constraints of the current COVID environment.

Special mention must be made to the following for their outstanding efforts for the season:

- The Tugun Junior's for an exceptional all round effort. From BBQ revenue to grant submissions, the effort here has been instrumental in the financial success of the Club this year.
- Paul Bell and Greg Hamilton (and support team) for their dedication to our club raffles each week. This is an enormous task and a vital part of revenue generation and guest relations for both clubs. Thank you all.
- Roger Dibden yet again manages our First Aid capability and compliance. His diligence in the performance of these duties is invaluable to our Club and cannot be underestimated. Thank you Roger.

Finally, I wish to thank both Club Committees and those Club members that have provided support and advice during my first year as Club Treasurer. I sincerely thank you all.

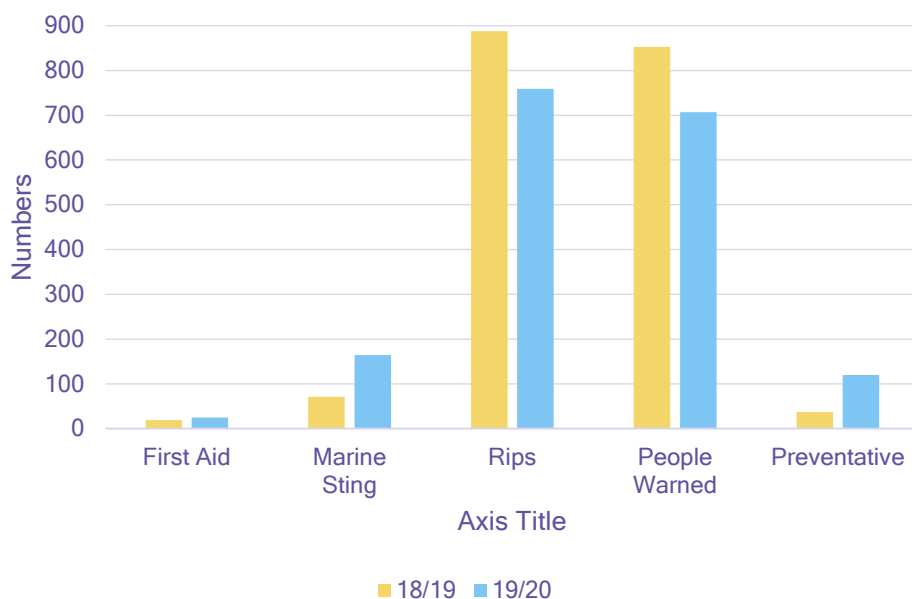

JUNIOR TREASUERS REPORT

Financially Tugun Nippers had a successful 19/20 season and showed a net profit of \$51397. This represents a substantial increase from the 18/19 season profit of \$4536. (Note: 19/20 profit includes a \$30,000 community gambling grant for new boards received in late March that will be expensed in the next financial year).

Our Bank Balance as at 30 April is \$76615, an increase on the previous year balance which was \$20,370

The majority of this year's profit came from three main areas - Corporate Sponsorship, BBQ and Fundraising, and community grants.



G & L Form work and Semi-Trailer rentals have been long term supporters of Tugun nippers and their continued generosity during the year was very much appreciated. It was also extremely pleasing to welcome two new sponsors to the club in MBA Lawyers and Oscar Oscar. We hope it is the start of a long relationship with two quality and community minded businesses. We also received much appreciated sponsorship from Bendigo Bank in the form of a new BBQ and a donation from the Tugun Winter Swimmers that enabled our youth team to enjoy a well-received development day.

The BBQ crew did an outstanding job during the year. A new menu with a focus on fresh produce resulted in takings more than doubling for the year. The countless hours of organisation and standing behind the hot BBQ on Sunday mornings is appreciated by all.

A big thank you to Kelly Star who helped secure the club multiple grants during the year including a grant that enabled us to order four new Tugun branded beach tents and also the before mentioned Board grant that will enable our club to meet the extra equipment demand derived from growing memberships.

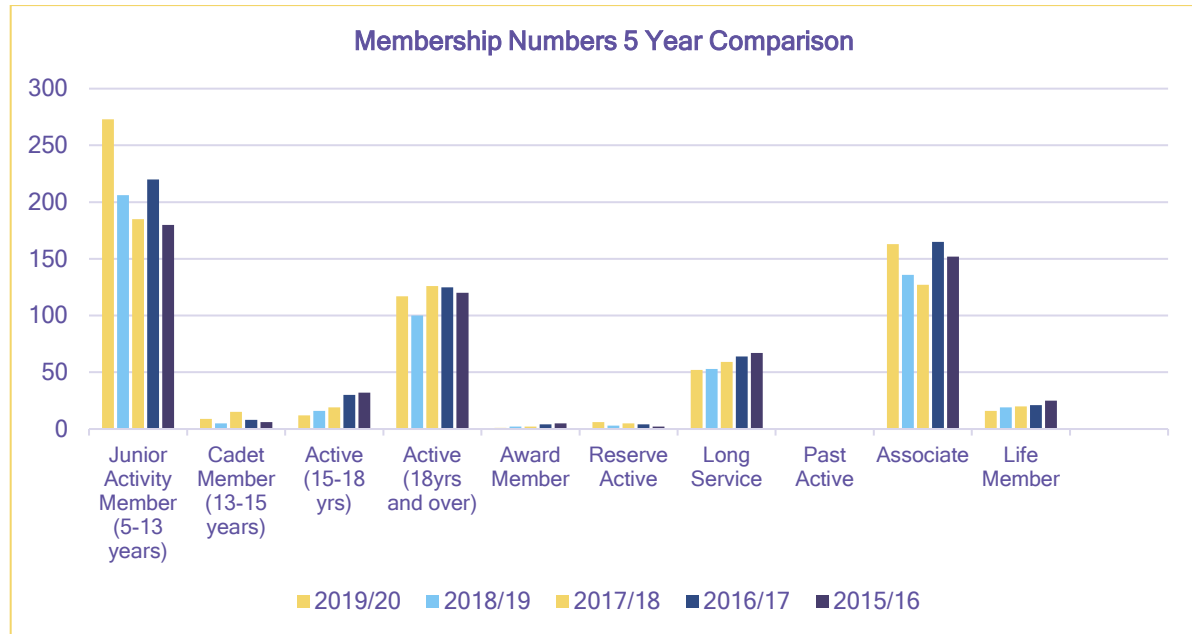

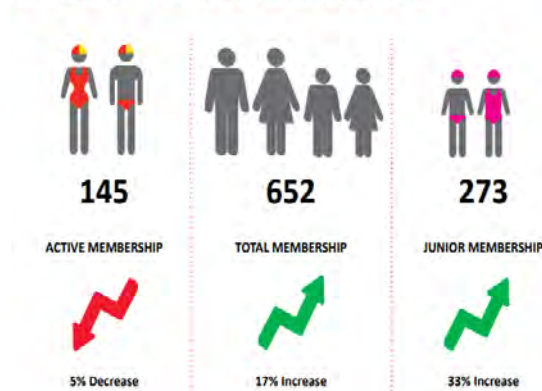

NOTE 1: SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Corporate Information

The financial statements are special purpose financial statements prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act and the Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Act. The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

Basis of Preparation

The financial statements are for the Tugun Surf Life Saving Club Inc as an individual entity, incorporated and domiciled in Australia. The Tugun Surf Life Saving Club Inc is an association incorporated in Queensland under the Associations Incorporation Act and is registered as a charity under the Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Act.

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historic costs and do not take into account changing money values or, except where stated specifically, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following Australian accounting standards have been applied in the preparation of these financial statements:

AASB 101 - Presentation of Financial Statements
AASB 107 - Statement of Cash Flows
AASB 108 - Accounting Policies, Changes in Accounting Estimates and Errors
AASB 1048 - Interpretation of Standards
AASB 1054 - Australian Additional Disclosures

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless stated otherwise, have been adopted in the preparation of these financial statements.

Accounting Policies

a. Income Tax

No provision for income tax has been raised as the association is exempt from income tax under Section 50-10 of the Income Tax Assessment Act. Tugun Surf Life Saving Club Inc is a Public Benevolent Institution (PBI) and has been endorsed by the Australian Taxation Office to receive tax concessions. Further, Tugun Surf Life Saving Club Inc is endorsed as a Deductible Gift Recipient (DGR).

b. Comparative Figures

When required by Accounting Standards, comparative figures have been adjusted to conform with changes in presentation for the current financial year. When required, comparative information is reclassified where appropriate to enhance comparability.

c. Economic Dependence

Tugun Surf Life Saving Club Inc is dependent on the Tugun Surf Life Saving Supporters Association Inc for funds used to meet its financial commitments. At the date of this report the committee members have no reason to believe the Tugun Surf Life Saving Supporters Association Inc will not continue to support Tugun Surf Life Saving Club Inc.

d. Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO).

Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of the amount of GST receivable or payable. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included with other receivables or payables in the Statement of Financial Position.

Cash flows are presented on a gross basis. The GST components of cash flows arising from investing or financing activities which are recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO are presented as operating cash flows included in receipts from customers or payments to suppliers.

e. Critical Accounting Estimates and Judgments

The committee of management evaluate estimates and judgments in the financial report based on historical knowledge and best available information. Estimates assume a reasonable expectation of future events and are based on current trends and economic data, obtained both externally and within the Association.

Key estimates

The estimate of the useful life of leasehold improvements, plant and equipment is reviewed at least annually to confirm that the remaining life of material assets is reflected on the asset register. There were no other critical accounting estimates to be considered during the year or during preparation of this financial report.

Key judgments

The methods of depreciation are used to provide a consistent usage of the useful life of leasehold improvements, plant and equipment. The methods also allow, where required, for the leasehold improvements, plant and equipment to be fully written down at a specific point in time such as the end of the lease term. There were no other critical accounting judgments made by the committee of management.

f. Contributions

If and when Tugun Surf Life Saving Club Inc receives non-reciprocal contributions from the government or other parties for nothing or a nominal value the contributions would be recognised at the fair value on the date of acquisition upon which time an asset is taken up in the Statement of Financial Position and revenue in the Statement of Profit or Loss and Other Comprehensive Income.

g. Revenue

Revenue from the sale of goods is recognised upon the delivery of goods to customers.

Grant revenue is recognised in the Statement of Profit or Loss and Other Comprehensive Income when the association obtains control of the grant and it is probable that the economic benefits gained from the grant will flow to the association and the amount of the grant can be measured reliably.

Donations and bequests are recognised as revenue when received.

Interest revenue is recognised on a proportional basis taking into account the interest rates applicable to the financial assets.

Revenue from the rendering of a service is recognised upon the delivery of the service to the customers.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

h. Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at-call with banks, other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of twelve months or less, and bank overdrafts.

i. Trade and Other Receivables

Trade and other receivables include amounts due from members as well as amounts receivable from other entities. Receivables expected to be collected within twelve months of the end of the reporting period are classified as current assets. All other receivables are classified as non-current assets.

j. Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

k. Property, Plant and Equipment

Each class of leasehold improvements, plant and equipment is carried at cost or fair value less, where applicable, accumulated depreciation and impairment losses.

Leasehold improvements, plant and equipment

Leasehold improvements, plant and equipment are measured on the cost basis and are therefore carried at cost less accumulated depreciation and any accumulated impairment losses. In the event the carrying amount of leasehold improvements, plant and equipment is greater than its estimated recoverable amount, the carrying amount is written down immediately to its estimated recoverable amount and impairment losses are recognised either in profit or loss or as a revaluation decrease if the impairment losses relate to a revalued asset. A formal assessment of recoverable amount is made when impairment indicators are present (refer to Note 1m for details of impairment).

Leasehold improvements, plant and equipment that have been contributed at no cost, or for nominal cost, are valued and recognised at the fair value of the asset at the date it is acquired.

Depreciation

The depreciable amount of leasehold improvements, plant and equipment is depreciated on a straight line basis over the asset's useful life to the association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use. The rates used for each class of depreciable assets are:

The assets' residual values and useful lives are reviewed, and adjusted if appropriate, at the end of each reporting period.

Gains and losses on disposals are determined by comparing proceeds with the carrying amount. These gains or losses are included in the Statement of Profit or Loss and Other Comprehensive Income. When revalued assets are sold, amounts included in the revaluation reserve relating to that asset are transferred to retained surplus.

l. Trade and Other Payables

Trade and other payables represent the liabilities for goods and services received by the association during the reporting period that remain unpaid at the end of the reporting period. The balance is recognised as a current liability with the amounts normally paid within thirty days of recognition of the liability.

m. Impairment of Assets

At the end of each reporting period, the committee members assess whether there is any indication that an asset may be impaired. If such an indication exists, an impairment test is carried out on the asset by comparing the recoverable amount of the asset, being the higher of the asset's fair value less costs to sell and value in use, to the asset's carrying amount. Any excess of the asset's carrying amount over its recoverable amount is recognised immediately in profit or loss, unless the asset is carried at a revalued amount in accordance with another Standard (e.g. in accordance with the revaluation model in AASB 116). Any impairment loss of a revalued asset is treated as a revaluation decrease in accordance with that other Standard.

Where it is not possible to estimate the recoverable amount of an individual asset, the committee members estimate the recoverable amount of the cash-generating unit to which the asset belongs.

n. Leases

Lease payments for operating leases, where substantially all the risks and benefits remain with the lessor, are recognised as expenses on a straight-line basis over the lease term.
