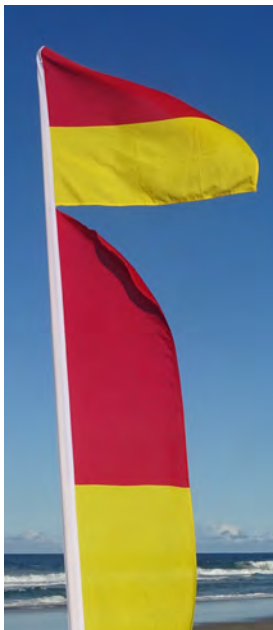

TREASURERS REPORT

The 2020-21 financial year shall be remembered for COVID-19 disruptions. The various government responses to the 'pandemic' impacted everyone and resulted in some very testing challenges. Both the Tugun SLSC and the Tugun Supporters Club were forced to cease operations and restrict member access during the year. These restrictions had the potential to severely limit our ability to retain members and impede the club's operating cash flow.

Despite this adversity, the Tugun SLSC has produced a generally impressive year in both Life Saving operations as well as Surf Sports competition and provided a modest surplus of \$9,759 for the year. This result would not have been possible without the astute management of the Tugun Supporters Club throughout the COVID-19 period. Regardless of the trade restrictions in place, the Supporters Club maintained all rent payments, assisted the surf club with access to government subsidies and still provided a generous donation to the Tugun SLSC. On behalf of the Executive committee and the members of the Tugun SLSC, I wish to sincerely thank the Board, the Management Team and staff of the Tugun Supporters Club, for a genuinely impressive performance in the face of adversity. Thank you.

Key revenue positives for the year:

- Rent revenue from the Tugun SLS Supporters Assoc Inc. of \$118,489.
- Sponsorships & Donations received of \$90,769.
- Government grants received of \$66,259.
- Membership fees of \$53,350
- Surf Carnival hosting revenue of \$17,653
- Surf Club raffle revenue of \$17,487.
- Nipper BBQ sales of \$29,127.



Operating expenses continue to be tightly monitored. The Club balance sheet remains stable with a Net Asset position of \$2.024 million and sound cash reserves.

The included Financial Report for 2020-21 contains comprehensive detail of all club financial activities.

Special mention to the following for their outstanding efforts for the season:

- Sharon Phillips for successfully securing a grant to fund the purchase of a new club 4WD.
- Rhyam Pankhurst for securing the QLD State titles for Tugun SLSC. A sensational event that we can all be proud of.
- The Tugun Junior Club for an exceptional all round effort.
- Ian Barfoot (Club Auditor) for his continued support and professionalism.
- Mark, Caroline, Sue and all the staff & Chefs of the Tugun Supporters Club, for assisting us with patrol meals and supporting our weekly raffle fundraising efforts.

Finally, my sincere thanks to the members of the Tugun SLSC Executive committee and those Club members that have continually supported the club throughout the year. Your efforts are recognised and greatly appreciated. Thank you.

After a less chaotic season, with the blossoming youth and relentless team effort from all patrolling members involved, lifesaving at Tugun is looking as glorious as ever.

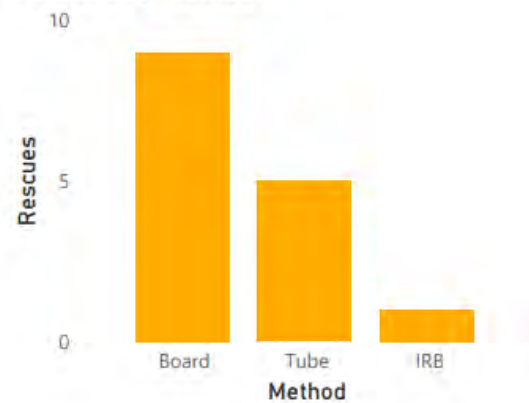

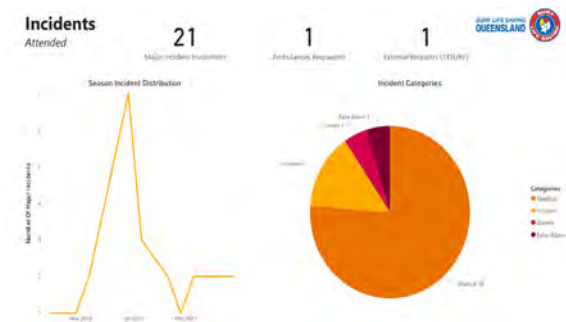
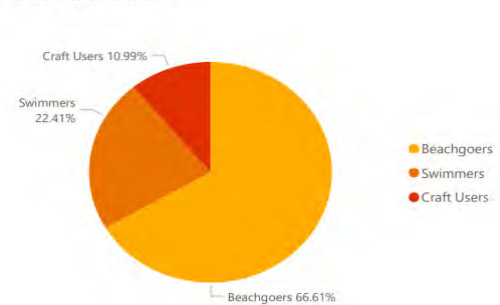

WATER SECTION REPORT

Season 2020/21 started with a lot of uncertainty after an off-season of Covid shutdowns, but once we were allowed back on the water the squad was raring to go. With a disappointing end to the season before, it put some fire in the belly and we set our sights on peaking at State and Aussie Titles to be held at Tugun and Maroochydore in March and April of this year.

This year bolstering our numbers and coming out of Murray's guidance from the nippers, we added some new under-14s to the squad. Technique and improving skills were our focus, as we worked through the early season program. The under-15s came back super keen to build on where they had been forced to leave off last year. Especially since they were on track to achieve some exciting results. All this was led by the great mentorship of the senior boys who had been together for years and are still committed to training hard. It is always great to have them as role models for our youth and future stars.

We were lucky enough to have 3 Ocean 38 local carnivals; one of them being hosted by Tugun. We use these carnivals as steppingstones to work on our processes as we progressed towards the bigger carnivals of the season. These carnivals always finished on a high, with a mixed bag of results, but always something learnt. Two Summer of Surfs were held on the Gold Coast this past year, which allowed us to put our skills to the test in a more competitive field. Chris Hunt did not disappoint by finishing with a 4th and 2nd in the open ski. We also travelled to the Sunshine Coast to compete in the Murphy's Builders Maroochy carnival, which was another opportunity to fine tune our skills and techniques as we got to the "pointy end" of the season. The Tugun cap was worn proudly and was well represented throughout the whole season.



We got to turn up in numbers for the Branch Titles at North Kirra. Here the whole team enjoyed the day and race more for bragging rights than anything else, with the experience of Sam Hamilton showing the younger boys how it's done.

We finished the season with our major carnivals – State Championships and the Aussie Titles. The Junior State Titles was run at North Kirra with our junior team turning up the most prepared they had been all season. Over the three days, with only a small team of 9 water and 2 beach competitors between the 14s and 15s, they turned up with quality, not quantity. It was a real joy to watch them stand on the start line with confidence and be ready to race. The whole team did themselves and the club proud. **Some of our top results included:**

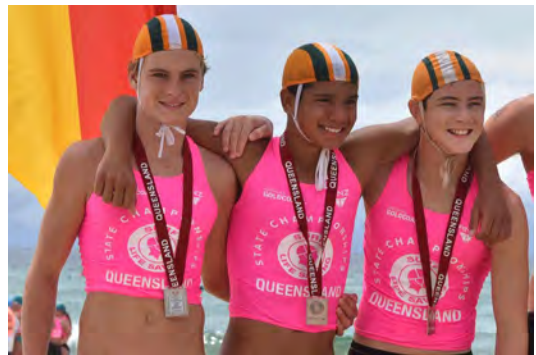

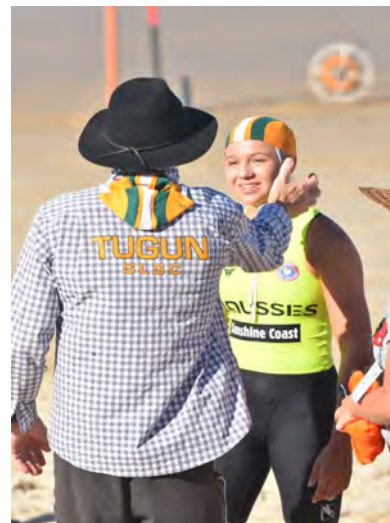

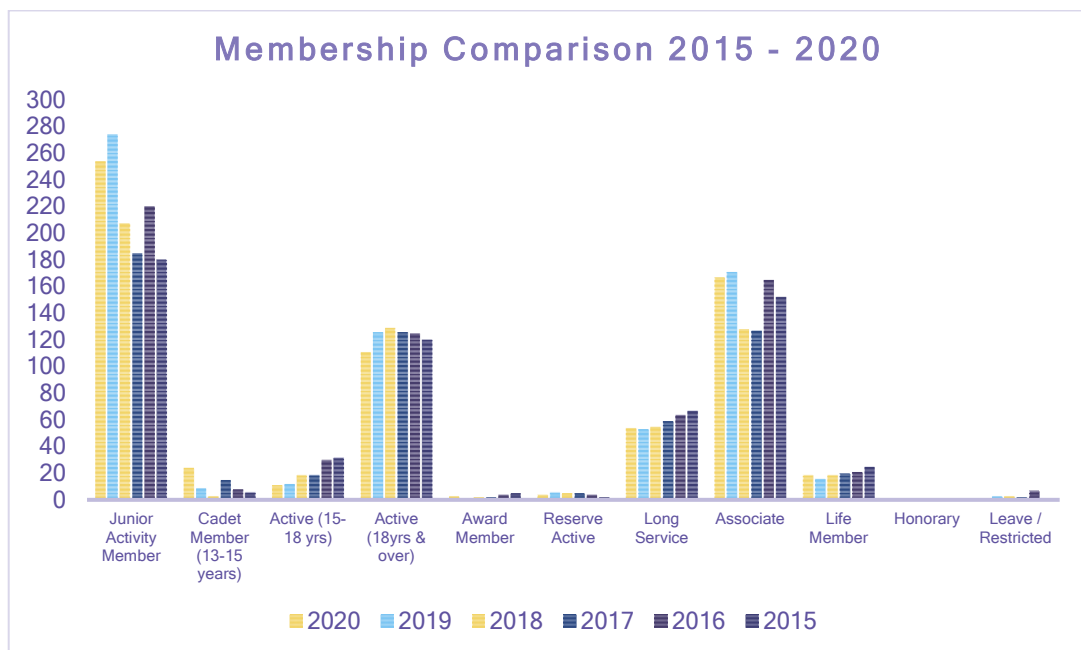

NOTE 1: SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Corporate Information

The financial statements are special purpose financial statements prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the *Associations Incorporation Act 1981 (Qld)* and the *Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Act 2012 (Cth)*. The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

Basis of Preparation

The financial statements are for the Tugun Surf Life Saving Club Inc as an individual entity, incorporated and domiciled in Australia. The Tugun Surf Life Saving Club Inc is an association incorporated in Queensland under the *Associations Incorporation Act 1981 (Qld)* and is registered as a charity under the *Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Act 2012 (Cth)*.

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historic costs and do not take into account changing money values or, except where stated specifically, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following Australian accounting standards have been applied in the preparation of these financial statements:

- AASB 101 - Presentation of Financial Statements
- AASB 107 - Statement of Cash Flows
- AASB 108 - Accounting Policies, Changes in Accounting Estimates and Errors
- AASB 1048 - Interpretation of Standards
- AASB 1054 - Australian Additional Disclosures

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless stated otherwise, have been adopted in the preparation of these financial statements.

Accounting Policies

a. Income Tax

No provision for income tax has been raised as the association is exempt from income tax under Section 50-10 of the *Income Tax Assessment Act 1997 (Cth)*. Tugun Surf Life Saving Club Inc is a Public Benevolent Institution (PBI) and has been endorsed by the Australian Taxation Office to receive tax concessions. Further, Tugun Surf Life Saving Club Inc is endorsed as a Deductible Gift Recipient (DGR).

b. Comparative Figures

When required by Accounting Standards, comparative figures have been adjusted to conform with changes in presentation for the current financial year. When required, comparative information is reclassified where appropriate to enhance comparability.

c. Economic Dependence

Tugun Surf Life Saving Club Inc is dependent on the Tugun Surf Life Saving Supporters Association Inc for funds used to meet its financial commitments. At the date of this report the committee members have no reason to believe the Tugun Surf Life Saving Supporters Association Inc will not continue to support Tugun Surf Life Saving Club Inc.

d. Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO).

Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of the amount of GST receivable or payable. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included with other receivables or payables in the Statement of Financial Position.

Cash flows are presented on a gross basis. The GST components of cash flows arising from investing or financing activities which are recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO are presented as operating cash flows included in receipts from customers or payments to suppliers.

e. Critical Accounting Estimates and Judgments

The committee of management evaluate estimates and judgments in the financial report based on historical knowledge and best available information. Estimates assume a reasonable expectation of future events and are based on current trends and economic data, obtained both externally and within the association.

Key estimates

The estimate of the useful life of leasehold improvements, plant and equipment is reviewed at least annually to confirm that the remaining life of material assets is reflected on the asset register. There were no other critical accounting estimates to be considered during the year or during preparation of this financial report.

Key judgments

The methods of depreciation are used to provide a consistent usage of the useful life of leasehold improvements, plant and equipment. The methods also allow, where required, for the leasehold improvements, plant and equipment to be fully written down at a specific point in time such as the end of the lease term. There were no other critical accounting judgments made by the committee of management.

f. Contributions

If and when Tugun Surf Life Saving Club Inc receives non-reciprocal contributions from the government or other parties for nothing or a nominal value the contributions would be recognised at the fair value on the date of acquisition upon which time an asset is taken up in the Statement of Financial Position and revenue in the Statement of Profit or Loss and Other Comprehensive Income.

g. Revenue

Revenue from the sale of goods is recognised upon the delivery of goods to customers.

Grant revenue is recognised in the Statement of Profit or Loss and Other Comprehensive Income when the association obtains control of the grant and it is probable that the economic benefits gained from the grant will flow to the association and the amount of the grant can be measured reliably.

Donations and bequests are recognised as revenue when received.

Interest revenue is recognised on a proportional basis taking into account the interest rates applicable to the financial assets.

Revenue from the rendering of a service is recognised upon the delivery of the service to the customers.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

h. Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at-call with banks, other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of twelve months or less, and bank overdrafts.

i. Trade and Other Receivables

Trade and other receivables include amounts due from members as well as amounts receivable from other entities. Receivables expected to be collected within twelve months of the end of the reporting period are classified as current assets. All other receivables are classified as non-current assets.

j. Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

k. Property, Plant and Equipment

Each class of leasehold improvements, plant and equipment is carried at cost or fair value less, where applicable, accumulated depreciation and impairment losses.

Leasehold improvements, plant and equipment

Leasehold improvements, plant and equipment are measured on the cost basis and are therefore carried at cost less accumulated depreciation and any accumulated impairment losses. In the event the carrying amount of leasehold improvements, plant and equipment is greater than its estimated recoverable amount, the carrying amount is written down immediately to its estimated recoverable amount and impairment losses are recognised either in profit or loss or as a revaluation decrease if the impairment losses relate to a revalued asset. A formal assessment of recoverable amount is made when impairment indicators are present (refer to Note 1n for details of impairment).

Leasehold improvements, plant and equipment that have been contributed at no cost, or for nominal cost, are valued and recognised at the fair value of the asset at the date it is acquired.

Depreciation

The depreciable amount of leasehold improvements, plant and equipment is depreciated on a straight line basis over the asset's useful life to the association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use. The rates used for each class of depreciable assets are:

The assets' residual values and useful lives are reviewed, and adjusted if appropriate, at the end of each reporting period.

Gains and losses on disposals are determined by comparing proceeds with the carrying amount. These gains or losses are included in the Statement of Profit or Loss and Other Comprehensive Income. When revalued assets are sold, amounts included in the revaluation reserve relating to that asset are transferred to retained surplus.

l. Employee Benefits

Retirement benefit obligations - superannuation benefits

All employees of the association receive defined contribution superannuation entitlements, for which the association pays the fixed superannuation guarantee contribution (currently 9.5% of the employee's average ordinary salary) to the employee's superannuation fund of choice. All obligations for unpaid superannuation guarantee contributions are measured at the (undiscounted) amounts expected to be paid when the obligation is settled and are recognised as trade and other payables under current liabilities in the association's Statement of Financial Position.

Short-term employee benefits

Provision is made for the association's obligation for short-term employee benefits. Short-term employee benefits are benefits (other than termination benefits) that are expected to be settled wholly within twelve months after the end of the annual reporting period in which the employees render the related service, including wages, salaries, annual leave and long service leave. Short-term employee benefits are measured at the (undiscounted) amounts expected to be paid when the obligation is settled. The association's obligations for short-term employee benefits are recognised as trade and other payables under current liabilities in the Statement of Financial Position.

Long-term employee benefits

At the end of each reporting period, the committee members assess whether there is any indication that an asset may be impaired. If such an indication exists, an impairment test is carried out on the asset by comparing the recoverable amount of the asset, being the higher of the asset's fair value less costs to sell and value in use, to the asset's carrying amount. Any excess of the asset's carrying amount over its recoverable amount is recognised immediately in profit or loss, unless the asset is carried at a revalued amount in accordance with another Standard (e.g. in accordance with the revaluation model in AASB 116). Any impairment loss of a revalued asset is treated as a revaluation decrease in accordance with that other Standard.

Where it is not possible to estimate the recoverable amount of an individual asset, the committee members estimate the recoverable amount of the cash-generating unit to which the asset belongs.

o. Leases

Lease payments for operating leases, where substantially all the risks and benefits remain with the lessor, are recognised as expenses on a straight-line basis over the lease term.

The association's obligations for long-term employee benefits are recognised as provisions under non-current liabilities in its Statement of Financial Position, except where the association does not have an unconditional right to defer settlement for at least twelve months after the end of the reporting period, in which case the obligations are recognised as trade and other payables under current liabilities in the Statement of Financial Position.

m. Trade and Other Payables

Trade and other payables represent the liabilities for goods and services received by the association during the reporting period that remain unpaid at the end of the reporting period. The balance is recognised as a current liability with the amounts normally paid within thirty days of recognition of the liability.

n. Impairment of Assets

At the end of each reporting period, the committee members assess whether there is any indication that an asset may be impaired. If such an indication exists, an impairment test is carried out on the asset by comparing the recoverable amount of the asset, being the higher of the asset's fair value less costs to sell and value in use, to the asset's carrying amount. Any excess of the asset's carrying amount over its recoverable amount is recognised immediately in profit or loss, unless the asset is carried at a revalued amount in accordance with another Standard (e.g. in accordance with the revaluation model in AASB 116). Any impairment loss of a revalued asset is treated as a revaluation decrease in accordance with that other Standard.

Where it is not possible to estimate the recoverable amount of an individual asset, the committee members estimate the recoverable amount of the cash-generating unit to which the asset belongs.

o. Leases

Lease payments for operating leases, where substantially all the risks and benefits remain with the lessor, are recognised as expenses on a straight-line basis over the lease term.
