Surf Life Saving Queensland (SLSQ) is pleased to announce the following changes to LIMSOC from Monday 1 November 2021. These new updates are a vital part of the continual improvement in integrating LIMSOC and other applications to reduce administration for our members and clubs.

Changes include:

- Simplified and modernised forms
- New paperless patrol (attendance log)
- Club insights and statistics
- Access to an overview of previous incident and rescue data to provide situational awareness

SLSQ has rolled the new version out to our training area to assist clubs prepare for the transition and allow for feedback and suggestions. All members are encouraged to log in and try out the new features, particularly the new paperless patrols feature.

Note: the training area is entirely separate from the live area; however, it would be appreciated if the member could sign off their patrol after use so other members can use the area also.

SLSQ has also provided a step-by-step user guide for clubs to utilise in the transition over to the updated system. Access levels for LIMSOC will continued to be dependent on the role held within the club.



User Interface (UI)

Based on the collective organisation's feedback, the new user interface makes using the app more accessible, quicker and simpler. The new user interface swaps text fields with buttons and toggles and adds context with popups and prompts, primarily intended for mobile phone and tablet usage.

Paperless Patrols

There will be various stage to implementing the Paperless Patrols, the initial stage included in this update will allow members to sign onto patrol using the LIMSOC app.

Club Administrators will then be able to produce a report of all patrolling members from throughout the weekend and input the data into Surfguard as per the normal process for recording of patrol hours. Instructions on how to produce the report are located in the LIMSOC Club User Guide.

Part two of this project is due early 2022, which will then automatically populate patrol hours (captured in LIMSOC) into Surfguard, requiring only a quick review and approval from the Club Administrator.
