Treasurer Report

The Tugun SLSC Inc has once again performed well for the 2022-23 season. An operating surplus of \$121,187 for the year represents an increase of \$43,893 (56.8%) on the \$77,294 surplus reported for the 2021-22 season. This is an extremely pleasing result and thanks must go to all those that have contributed actively to Club fundraising throughout the year.

Cash reserves have also increased during the year. Current cash reserves of \$427,637 represent an increase of \$158,900 (59.1%) on those reported at year-end 2022. Particular thanks for this must go to the Tugun SLS Supporters Club for their continued financial support of the Surf Club's operations.

It is expected that a significant portion of the current cash reserves shall be utilised to continue the extensive building compliance works presently being undertaken by the Club. As we are all aware, this project is comprehensive and shall require significant resources to complete. The end goal of the compliance works is obviously to see the installation of disabled access lifts to the Club building. Many thanks must go to Club President Brett Beutel for leading this extremely complex and time-consuming project.

It was very satisfying to see so many favourable results in the surf sports arena throughout the season. The dedication and planning provided by the surf sports team over the last 4 years is truly beginning to pay dividends. I expect our continued investment in the surf sports area shall see the Club well placed to perform well as we head to our 100th year in 2025.

The included Financial Report for 2022-23 contains comprehensive detail of all club financial activities throughout the year.


There are several members, who have demonstrated excellent service this season. I would like to give a special mention to the following:

The 2022/23 season was another busy year in terms of delivering essential training to our Tugun members. Over this season the training group of Roger Dibden and myself, with exceptional administrative assistance from Sharon Phillips, delivered 5 Skills Maintenance courses, 3 Surf Rescue Certificate courses and 2 Bronze courses, all with a 100 percent success rate. It was also great to see our nipper parents take the opportunity to gain an SRC award as part of the Nipper water safety program and for some to take the step to becoming patrolling members.

Overall, the number of Tugun members completing each award were:

Skills Maintenance: 192
Surf Rescue Certificate: 24
Bronze Medallion: 15
IRB Crew: 3
ART: 4

This season Sharon was again instrumental in ensuring the essential administrative aspects of running each course are met and her future inputs will be sorely missed in the coming season. Unknown to many, Sharon also spends considerable time preparing submissions to various granting bodies for funding support for essential Club equipment. Through Sharon's


efforts, the Club received funding for three new rescue boards dedicated to training and have recently received funding to purchase new resuscitation manikins.

Director of Surf Sports Report

2022–23 has unquestionably been the most successful season in the previous ten years! Thank you for an incredible season, members, competitors, parents, water safety, first aiders, officials, and volunteers. Being a volunteer organisation, we rely largely on your assistance and selfless dedication to growing our club and supporting its members.

It was lovely to get back to some semblance of normality in the 2022–23 season and focus on consistent training and carnivals. Once again, the season kicked off to a busy start with the hosting of the Oceans 38 and the Kellogg's Nutri-Grain trials, which once again demonstrated what an incredible support crew we have in place. Then, Inter-Branch, Branch, and the State Titles at Mooloolaba Beach followed.



Throughout the season, there were several incredible results, not only that produced medals, but rather personal goals and accomplishments over the previous season. Ziah Peisker winning the U17 ski and backing up and joining Ryan Muggeridge and Jake French to win the men's U17 ski relay was an amazing effort, and bronze in the women's U17 beach relay were standout performances from the State Titles. The Aussies at Scarborough Beach in Western Australia produced thrilling results, with Milla Seaton winning the U13 female board race and Grace Hughes taking first place in the U14 Ironwoman and 3rd in the U14 Female Board Race, following in her sisters - Allie shoes to repeat such a win. Team outcomes are a reflection of the club, and the men's U17 board and ski relays showed a lot of heart to win a bronze and silver respectively in both events after nail-biting finishes.



Alongside Head Coach Kelly Margetts, ex -Olympian and ski coach Jordan Wood joined the coaching staff. I remember Jordan joining his parents at carnivals many years ago as a baby and we are so very grateful to have his experience at the club and now sharing it with his own growing family. Again, we kicked off training in June 2022 building board and ski skills with the U14 and U15 members, while the senior crew began banking their preseason kilometres. Pre-season workouts are crucial because they provide the groundwork for a successful season by promoting endurance, skill development, and the prevention of injuries. I want to thank coach Kelly once more for another fantastic season and for taking the initiative to start a month earlier than usual. I believe it paid off once the competition program got going. Kelly's passion for those he coaches is evident and he demonstrates that being a coach also involves being a mentor which he blends beautifully.

It can't go without mentioning our club admin Sharon Phillips who tirelessly goes over and above what her role is and sees all competitors, with the help of Jane Dillion, entered, organised and up to date. Our team manager, Karl Muggeridge also deserves and massive thank you for taking on the role to not only to support the athletes but keep them motivated, on the line on time and believing anything is possible.



Callum Taylor got right into the swing of things with his new position of Head Beach Coach while also assisting with off-season strength and gym work, which undoubtedly played a huge part as the season progressed to the crucial point where the results counted. The track and beach sessions were well-attended, and both the seniors' and the juniors' performances in the competitions broke long-standing records. Lily Alford was chosen to represent QLD at the interstate titles in the beach events being the sole representee of the club. Lily alongside Amy Cronk and Lily McClure were forces to be reckoned with over the season in both the U17 female flags and beach sprints all claiming valuable points for the club's overall point score. Watching talent meet skill and intensive training in this environment is exciting!



Bendigo Bank recently awarded us a grant of \$5000, which we will utilise to buy some new racing mals. These will be invaluable and help our competitors throughout the season with hiring arrangements as the number of junior and senior athletes grows. Sponsorship is an important key area the Club is hoping to expand

as our numbers of competitors also increase – Thankyou to Megan Calliste, Jane Dillion and Kristy Randall for your assistance with fund raising opportunities.

Our Boat Section has been on the rebuild this season and many thanks to David Mitchell for your efforts with this and coordination of the Boats Section Golf Day. This major fund raising continues to get bigger and bigger every year.



Finally, a big thank you to all of our officials, water safety, and IRB volunteers who give their time to carnivals all year long so that our athletes can compete. 














Tugun Investment Trust Report

This year we had a change in directors for Tugun SLSC Investments Pty Ltd, which is the trustee for the Tugun SLSC Investment Trust. Dave Mitchell stood down, following his election as Deputy President of the Supporters Club to ensure that the Trust maintains its independence from both the Surf Club and the Supporters Club. Dave has been a director for much of the time since the Trust's inception and a key driver in the Trust's activities. The initial investment in 2012 was \$264,000, and over the ensuing ten years this had grown to an asset value of \$809,978 on the balance sheet. The club truly owes Dave a debt of gratitude for his leadership and work for the Trust.

With Dave's departure, Craig Williams was appointed as his replacement. Being directors of a Pty Ltd company, the directors need to be registered with, and meet the ASIC standards, which now includes having a directors ID. Craig as a professional director and a Graduate Member of the Australian Institute of Company Directors undertook a process of due diligence prior to accepting the position. As a result, club members can be assured that the Trust is financially sound and meeting its fiduciary requirements. Not only that, the club can be confident it is fulfilling the desired outcome that was sort when established, in that;

- It has maintained the asset that the club realised from the sale of the original Coolangatta Road Flats.
- 2. It has made prudent investments in order to grow that asset, to help guarantee the financial future of the Tugun SLSC.

This year the Trust had a record income of \$63,635 and increased its total assets to \$850,051.







NOTE 1: SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Corporate Information

The financial statements are special purpose financial statements prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the *Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Act 2012* (Cth). The committee has determined that the Charity is not a reporting entity.

Basis of Preparation

The financial statements are for the Tugun Surf Life Saving Club Inc as an individual entity, incorporated and domiciled in Australia. The Tugun Surf Life Saving Club Inc is an association incorporated in Queensland under the Associations Incorporation Act 1981 (Qld) and is registered as a charity under the Australian Charities and Not-forprofits Commission Act 2012 (Cth).

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historic costs and do not take into account changing money values or, except where stated specifically, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following Australian accounting standards have been applied in the preparation of these financial statements:

AASB 101 - Presentation of Financial Statements

AASB 107 - Statement of Cash Flows

AASB 108 - Accounting Policies, Changes in Accounting Estimates and Errors

AASB 1048 - Interpretation of Standards

AASB 1054 - Australian Additional Disclosures

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless stated otherwise, have been adopted in the preparation of these financial statements.

Accounting Policies

a. Income Tax

No provision for income tax has been raised as the Charity is exempt from income tax under Section 50-10 of the *Income Tax Assessment Act 1997* (Cth). Tugun Surf Life Saving Club Inc is a Public Benevolent Institution (PBI) and has been endorsed by the Australian Taxation Office (ATO) to receive tax concessions. Further, Tugun Surf Life Saving Club Inc is endorsed as a Deductible Gift Recipient (DGR).

b. Comparative Figures

When required by these accounting policies, comparative figures have been adjusted to conform with changes in presentation for the current financial year. When required, comparative information is reclassified where appropriate to enhance comparability.

c. Economic Dependence

Tugun Surf Life Saving Club Inc is dependent on lease income and donations from the Tugun Surf Life Saving Supporters Association Inc for funds used to meet it's financial commitments. At the date of this report the committee members have no reason to believe the Tugun Surf Life Saving Supporters Association Inc will not continue to honour the lease agreement and the donations agreement.

d. Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the ATO.

Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of the amount of GST receivable or payable. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included with other receivables or payables in the Statement of Financial Position.

Cash flows are presented on a gross basis. The GST components of cash flows arising from investing or financing activities which are recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO are presented as operating cash flows included in receipts from customers or payments to suppliers.

NOTE 1: SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

e. Critical Accounting Estimates and Judgments

The committee of management evaluate estimates and judgments in the financial report based on historical knowledge and best available information. Estimates assume a reasonable expectation of future events and are based on current trends and economic data, obtained both externally and within the Charity.

Key estimates

The estimate of the useful life of leasehold improvements, plant and equipment is reviewed at least annually to confirm that the remaining life of material assets is reflected on the asset register. There were no other critical accounting estimates to be considered during the year or during preparation of this financial report.

Key judgments

The methods of depreciation are used to provide a consistent usage of the useful life of leasehold improvements, plant and equipment. The methods also allow, where required, for the leasehold improvements, plant and equipment to be fully written down at a specific point in time such as the end of the lease term. There were no other critical accounting judgments made by the committee of management.

f. Contributions

If and when Tugun Surf Life Saving Club Inc receives non-reciprocal contributions from the government or other parties for nothing or a nominal value the contributions would be recognised at the fair value on the date of acquisition upon which time an asset is taken up in the Statement of Financial Position and revenue in the Statement of Profit or Loss and Other Comprehensive Income.

g. Revenue

Revenue from the sale of goods is recognised upon the delivery of goods to customers.

Grant revenue is recognised in the Statement of Profit or Loss and Other Comprehensive Income when the Charity obtains control of the grant and it is probable that the economic benefits gained from the grant will flow to the Charity and the amount of the grant can be measured reliably.

Donations and bequests are recognised as revenue when received.

Interest revenue is recognised on a proportional basis taking into account the interest rates applicable to the financial assets.

Revenue from the rendering of a service is recognised upon the delivery of the service to the customers.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

h. Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at-call with banks, other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of twelve months or less, and bank overdrafts.

i. Trade and Other Receivables

Trade and other receivables include amounts due from members as well as amounts receivable from other entities. Receivables expected to be collected within twelve months of the end of the reporting period are classified as current assets. All other receivables are classified as non-current assets.

j. Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

NOTE 1: SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

k. Property, Plant and Equipment

Each class of leasehold improvements, plant and equipment is carried at cost or fair value less, where applicable, accumulated depreciation and impairment losses.

Leasehold improvements, plant and equipment

Leasehold improvements, plant and equipment are measured on the cost basis and are therefore carried at cost less accumulated depreciation and any accumulated impairment losses. In the event the carrying amount of leasehold improvements, plant and equipment is greater than its estimated recoverable amount, the carrying amount is written down immediately to its estimated recoverable amount and impairment losses are recognised either in profit or loss or as a revaluation decrease if the impairment losses relate to a revalued asset. A formal assessment of recoverable amount is made when impairment indicators are present (refer to Note 1n for details of impairment).

Leasehold improvements, plant and equipment that have been contributed at no cost, or for nominal cost, are valued and recognised at the fair value of the asset at the date it is acquired.

Depreciation

The depreciable amount of leasehold improvements, plant and equipment is depreciated on a straight line basis over the asset's useful life to the Charity commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use. The rates used for each class of depreciable assets are:

The assets' residual values and useful lives are reviewed, and adjusted if appropriate, at the end of each reporting period.

Gains and losses on disposals are determined by comparing proceeds with the carrying amount. These gains or losses are included in the Statement of Profit or Loss and Other Comprehensive Income. When revalued assets are sold, amounts included in the revaluation reserve relating to that asset are transferred to retained surplus.

I. Employee Benefits

Retirement benefit obligations - superannuation benefits

All employees of the Charity receive defined contribution superannuation entitlements, for which the Charity pays the fixed superannuation guarantee contribution (currently 10.5% [11.0% from 01 July 2023] of the employee's average ordinary salary) to the employee's superannuation fund of choice. All obligations for unpaid superannuation guarantee contributions are measured at the (undiscounted) amounts expected to be paid when the obligation is settled and are recognised as trade and other payables under current liabilities in the Charity's Statement of Financial Position.

Short-term employee benefits

Provision is made for the Charity's obligation for short-term employee benefits. Short-term employee benefits are benefits (other than termination benefits) that are expected to be settled wholly within twelve months after the end of the annual reporting period in which the employees render the related service, including wages, salaries, annual leave and long service leave. Short-term employee benefits are measured at the (undiscounted) amounts expected to be paid when the obligation is settled. The Charity's obligations for short-term employee benefits are recognised as trade and other payables under current liabilities in the Statement of Financial Position.

NOTE 1: SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

I. Employee Benefits (continued)

Long-term employee benefits

The Charity only classifies employees' long service leave entitlements as long-term employee benefits as they are not expected to be settled wholly within twelve months after the end of the annual reporting period in which the employees render the related service. Provision is made for the Charity's obligation for long-term employee benefits, which are measured at the present value of the expected future payments to be made to employees. Expected future payments incorporate anticipated future wage and salary levels, durations of service and employee departures, and are discounted at rates determined by reference to market yields at the end of the reporting period on government bonds that have maturity dates that approximate the terms of the obligations. Upon the remeasurement of obligations for long-term employee benefits, the net change in the obligation is recognised in profit or loss classified under employee benefits expense.

The Charity's obligations for long-term employee benefits are recognised as provisions under non-current liabilities in its Statement of Financial Position, except where the Charity does not have an unconditional right to defer settlement for at least twelve months after the end of the reporting period, in which case the obligations are recognised as trade and other payables under current liabilities in the Statement of Financial Position.

m. Trade and Other Payables

Trade and other payables represent the liabilities for goods and services received by the Charity during the reporting period that remain unpaid at the end of the reporting period. The balance is recognised as a current liability with the amounts normally paid within thirty days of recognition of the liability.

n. Impairment of Assets

At the end of each reporting period, the committee members assess whether there is any indication that an asset may be impaired. If such an indication exists, an impairment test is carried out on the asset by comparing the recoverable amount of the asset, being the higher of the asset's fair value less costs to sell and value in use, to the asset's carrying amount. Any excess of the asset's carrying amount over its recoverable amount is recognised immediately in profit or loss, unless the asset is carried at a revalued amount in accordance with another Standard (e.g. in accordance with the revaluation model in AASB 116). Any impairment loss of a revalued asset is treated as a revaluation decrease in accordance with that other Standard.

Where it is not possible to estimate the recoverable amount of an individual asset, the committee members estimate the recoverable amount of the cash-generating unit to which the asset belongs.

o. Leases

Lease payments for operating leases, where substantially all the risks and benefits remain with the lessor, are recognised as expenses on a straight-line basis over the lease term.
